STRUCTURE OF MUN



The **Executive Board (EB)** in MUN manages and moderates committee sessions, ensures rules are followed, guides debate, evaluates delegates, and oversees resolutions. It includes a Chairperson, Vice-Chair, and Rapporteur. The Organizing Committee is led by the **Secretary-General** and Director-General, with USGs heading Academics, Marketing/PR, Finance, Logistics, and Events, handling agenda setting, promotions, funding, venue arrangements, and ceremonies.

COMMITTEES AND AGENDAS

UNITED NATIONS GENERAL ASSEMBLY



The **United Nations General Assembly (UNGA DISEC)** is the primary deliberative body of the United Nations (UN), where all 193 member states have equal representation. It serves as a global platform for diplomacy, discussion, and decision-making on the world's most pressing issues, including peace and security, human rights, sustainable development, and international law.

Agenda: “Regulating Private Military Companies and Non - State Actors in Armed Conflicts”



The **United Nations Human Rights Council (UNHRC)** is a UN body established in 2006 to promote and protect human rights worldwide. Made up of 47 member states elected by the General Assembly, it addresses serious violations, reviews global issues, and makes recommendations through reports and resolutions. It also conducts the Universal Periodic Review to assess the human rights records of all UN member states.

Agenda: “Regulating the Use of Artificial Intelligence in Policing and Surveillance”



The United Nations Security Council (UNSC) is one of the most powerful bodies of the United Nations and is responsible for maintaining international peace and security. Established in 1945, it has 15 members, including five permanent members: United States, United Kingdom, France, Russia, and China, who hold veto power, along with ten non permanent members elected for two year terms. The Council addresses global conflicts, authorizes peacekeeping missions, imposes sanctions, and may approve military action when necessary. Its resolutions are legally binding on all Member States, making it a central institution in maintaining international peace and security.

Agenda: “The Escalation of Proxy Conflicts and Their Impact on International Peace and Stability”

ALL INDIA POLITICAL PARTIES MEET



The **All India Political Parties Meet (AIPPM)** is a key consultative platform where representatives from political parties across the country discuss issues of national importance. It promotes dialogue, consensus, and cooperation on governance, public welfare, and national security. By uniting leaders with diverse ideologies, the forum addresses challenges, builds common strategies, and strengthens democratic values, contributing to a stable and accountable political system in India.

Agenda: “Deliberation on the Constitutional, Political, and Federal Implications of the Revocation of Article 370, with Special Emphasis on National Integration, State Autonomy, and the Federal Structure of India”.



WORLD ECONOMIC FORUM

The World Economic Forum (WEF) committee is a high-level platform where global leaders, policymakers, and industry experts discuss key economic and development challenges. Delegates represent countries, corporations, or institutions and focus on economic stability, sustainable growth, climate action, digital transformation, and public–private partnerships. The discussions are solution-oriented, aiming to create practical strategies and long-term reforms through collaboration and consensus.

Agenda: “Geo Economic Fragmentation and Global Economic Stability”

INTERNATIONAL PRESS CONFERENCE



International Press (IP) is the media wing of the conference, where participants act as journalists instead of representing countries. They observe committee sessions, report on debates, analyze resolutions, and publish articles or newsletters about the proceedings.

Members of IP also interview delegates and chairs, question policies, highlight key moments, and provide critical commentary. Their role adds realism by simulating global media coverage and holding delegates accountable for their statements and strategies. Strong writing skills, confidence, observation, and analytical thinking are essential for this role.
